Medford Area Senior High Collection Analysis November 2014

TitleWise is a collection analysis tool provided by our circulation and catalog vendor, Follett School Solutions. This program allows us to export and upload our entire collection for statistical analysis. By completing this study once each year, we can locate areas of the collection that need weeding and/or additional book purchases. We can also compare past surveys to determine if we are meeting our goal of providing a current, balanced collection.

The age of books does not always indicate that the book should be discarded. Classic literature, local history, art and specialized titles may still be very useful as they age. Also, as our curriculum evolves some titles are no longer used while other units require new resources. Based on the data from last November we weeded our books in the non-fiction 900s, reference, atlases, dictionaries and fiction. Analysis

Holdings: National average: 18 books per student in a high school **MASH**

- ☑ Volumes: 13,957 (14,004 in 2013; 12,259 in 2003)
- ☑ Books per student: 22.36 (22.44 in 2013; 14 in 2003)

Average Age: 2002

- ☑ Up from 2001 in 2013

The Age Sensitivity - Which sections are showing their age?

- ☑ 86% of our geography, atlas and maps are older than 5 years
- ☑ Even though we improved the average age of our science collection to 2004:
 - o 58% of our Medical science books are older than 5 years
 - o 57% of our Astronomy and Allied Science books are older than 5 years
 - o 69% of Life Science and Biology are older than 5 years
- ☑ Art and literature books average 2001 and 1994 respectively, however older books in these areas may still be useful
- ☑ Fifty-six percent of our computer books are older than three years, compared to 47% last year
- ☑ Improved the average age of fiction to 2005
- ☑ AV collection average is now at 1998

Follett Criteria - Recommended number books in each section

☑ We hold higher than recommended number of books in fiction, psychology and history

- ☑ We hold significantly fewer titles than recommended in:
 - Reference
 - Science/Math
 - Literature
- ☑ We hold slightly fewer titles than recommended in:
 - Social Studies
 - Language

The average age of a collection moves slowly. We purchase new books and weed out old items each year. In the past year, our average age of collection moved from 2001 to 2002. Since 2003 we improved our average age from 1986 to 2002. Our AV collection is now supplemented by Safari Montage and can be weeded. By reviewing the collection with both Dewey sections and copyright age, we are able to weed through the entire collection every two to three years. If we continue at this pace, we should make good progress each year on our goal to provide a current collection.
